* Originally the summer home of several generations of the prominate English family dating back to the mid-1800's, Englishton Park is now a 300+ acre multi-use campus affiliated with the Presbyterian Church serving the needs of children and the community at large.

** Settled in 1804 and platted in 1810, Lexington was considered for the first state capital of Indiana. It serve as the county seat until 1874 when Scottsburg took over. This area was largely settled by people from the Upper South, traveling by the Ohio River, but many settlers also came West on the Cincinnati Trace which cut a 201 mile path through the forrest all the way to Vincennes.
