Trash Pick Up, 2013

On April 27, 2013, fifteen (15) club members participated in our trash pickup on highway 31 between Perry Crossing Road and Memphis, Indiana. The cleaning of the highway took less than two hours.

Twenty (20) members participated in the first trash pickup started by Dan Widner in 1992. Seventy (70) bags of trash were collected.

In 1995, Dan moved from this area and Paul Beach took over this community project.

Paul usually schedules 3 to 4 trash pickup's per year. Paul is always on hand with signs, vests, bags, and most important, the helping hands or as I call them, trash picker uppers. As the trash is collected, full bags or trash are placed on the right side of the road going north. Paul pre-arranges with the county for the trash to be picked up.

Memphis Truck Stop is the meeting place for the pickup, rain or shine. We usually caravan to Highway 31, members start at Perry Crossing, Memphis and the bridge in between. Through the years Paul has had as few as three (3) members and up to twenty (20) members participate in this community event. Two (2) hours is allotted for this event with a club ride following. The more members that participate, the less time it takes to complete.

Thanks to all of our members who have participated. I encourage each of you to come out and see if you can find the most unusual item. Just to mention a few items previously found are: tires, aluminum siding, various sex items, insulation, tools, CD's and always plenty of discarded trash.

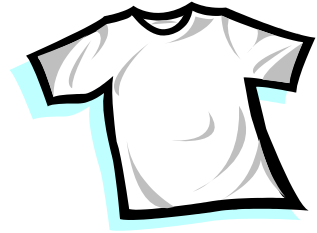
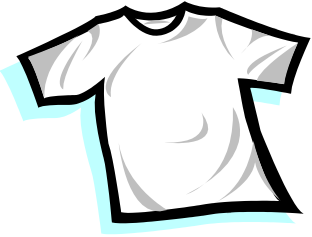
