# Our Katy Trail Bike Trip Not What We Thought It Would Be By Bill Horton

This trip was about a year in the planning. It started with a short vacation to the area last fall with my wife to get some ideas for a good bike trip. We came away with the impression that the charm in such a trip would be exploring the Missouri River Valley history and mingling with the locals along the way – on the Trail and at the restaurants, pubs and wineries. While the route runs parallel to the Missouri River, the tree cover prevents viewing the river the majority of the time. So it wasn't going to be the most scenic trip ever – but interesting, none the less.

Roger Bottorff signed up to go with me. The plan was to drive to St. Louis and take the Amtrak from the Kirkwood train station to Sedalia, some 220 miles west. Then we would ride bikes back to the train station, where my truck was parked. We would be staying at historic old hotels in Boonville, Jefferson City and McKittrick. Then a Wingate Hotel in Weldon Spring for some R & R. Finally a mid-day visit to historic St. Charles.

We've had a lot of interest from many SIW members, which made us feel pretty good, but the trip turned out to be a total bust. Here's what happened.

We drove to Kirkwood on September 5<sup>th</sup> and got a hotel room. After a good steak dinner, we packed up all our gear. The Amtrak train permits several bikes to be transported fully assembled. So we would hang our bikes in their luggage car and carry our pannier bags on board with us. The last thing we did that evening was listen to the weather report.

You may recall that Hurricane Florence was pounding North Carolina and moving in our direction. We also had a strong storm cell in Kansas, also moving in our direction. We knew we would get wet, but we were already in St. Louis. We thought we had to do it. The last thing the weatherman said as we were drifting off to sleep was "Watch out for flash flooding along the Missouri River Valley."

At 2 am I bolted upright in bed when the weather report finally hit home. I had visited the valley the year before and remembered all the little streams with little foot bridges we would have to cross. I lay awake the rest of the night, trying to figure a way to avoid cancelling the trip. No solution came to mind.

So when Roger woke up in the morning, I gave him the bad news. Getting wet would be one thing, but drowning in a flash flood was something else. So we packed up, had a solid breakfast and headed home. Looking back, the best part of the trip was the food.
